Councilor Taylor states he is glad to be back from his vacation as he missed this place.

#### **SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS REPORTS:**

Superintendent Andrews states he spoke to the Town of Brandon, and they want to buy one of our items that is already considered surplus. They want to buy the 10-inch Tarco Slide in Sander for the same amount we counteroffered, and we did not get. Andrews states on another note for the past three weeks he has spoken to his committee members and the code officer about his concerns with the highway department. He states he would like to request from the town board to designate from the infrastructure ARPA money for an addition added to the highway department. The addition would be to put my office and my clerk down on the ground level. My biggest concern is to make it handicap accessible, insurance purposes for the general public, they just roam around and have a chance of possibly getting hurt trying to find my office which is upstairs. 80% of the people who come to see me are 70 - 80-year-olds. I have had an incident recently where my mechanic was screaming for help because a 82-year-old gentlemen on the 5th stair was trying to get to my office. It would pertain to a public restroom as it is a public building, the situation we have right now with my clerk is the bathroom does not work for her due to what is in it. I feel that having the offices on ground level would be a lot safer for the public and my employees. The size of the addition would be 24 x 28, in between the two front overhead doors, that way the public cant risk getting hurt by trying to find the offices. Andrews states all the labor would be done by the highway crew. Along with the addition I would like to pave the parking lot, there are many potholes and people walking though have a chance of falling. He states I don't want to blame anybody but three years ago it was allowed for a company to rip up the Blacktop and not was not made to re blacktop it. I am asking for \$87,000 designated from the ARPA money, it will begin within the first two weeks of September. Councilor Johnston states we should do something to spruce up the break room and bathroom in the back for the safety of the employees and it is time for it to be done. Superintendent Andrews states this won't take long at all, we are very lucky that most of our employees have so many other trades as well. Update on the roads, the Wheeler, Clark and Hick Road shoulders are done. Truck is fixed as well was three small filters. The Village of Malone reached out to me as well to let me know their paving starts August 21.
