Public Hearing for the West Side Sewer Project/Funding -

Tim Burley of C2AE presented an overview of the <u>Rt. 11 West, Sewer District 2, Proposed</u> <u>Collection System Improvements</u>. He distributed a map, showing the properties included in the project, which was modified to remove the west "leg" from the original plan. Mr. Burley reported that he and involved property owners met 1/13/13 and worked to determine how the district costs will be calculated and divided among the users: 10% by EDU; 30% by assessment; 30% based on frontage and 30% on acreage. **Supervisor Maneely** asked if the project will include destruction of the old line to Rt. 11B. Mr. Burley said the end of line can be dug up and plugged or broken so that it no longer functions. **Mr. Burley** said that much of the work is awaiting the expected funding from EFC.

ORDER ESTABLISHING SEWER DISTRICT IMPROVEMENT

WHEREAS, a map, plan and report have been prepared by Capital Consultants Architecture and Engineering ("C2AE"), Timothy Burley, P.E., in such detail as has heretofore been determined by the Town Board of the Town of Malone, New York (the "Town"), for providing the facilities, improvements or services in a portion of the Town served by the Route 11 West Sewer District (the "District"); and

WHEREAS, an Order Establishing Hearing on Sewer District Improvement was duly adopted by this Town Board on January 9, 2013, reciting the filing of said map, plan and report, the improvements proposed, the boundaries of the proposed district, the fact that the map, plan and report described in said Order also contained the method of financing any improvements, and that said map, plan and report were on file in the Town Clerk's Office for public inspection, and stating all other matters required by law to be stated and specifying January 23, 2013, as the date, at 5:45 p.m. on said day as the time, and the Town Hall, in the Town of Malone, Franklin County, New York as the place where the Town Board would meet for a Public Hearing to consider said map, plan and report, and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof, concerning the same, and to take such action thereon as is required or authorized by law; and

WHEREAS, such Order was duly published on January 11, 2013, in the Malone Telegram, the official legal newspaper for the Town, and further, said Order was duly posted on the official sign board which is kept for the posting of official notices; both Publication and Posting was in full compliance with Town Law; and

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing on the establishment of the District improvement was duly held by the Town Board on January 23, 2013, at 5:45 p.m. on said day, in the Town Hall, Town of Malone, Franklin County, New York, at which all interested persons desiring to be heard were heard, including those in favor of, and those opposed to, the establishment of the District improvement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, upon the evidence adduced at said Public Hearing, and all evidence in the record before the Town Board it is hereby determined as follows: FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The boundaries of the proposed District improvement are set forth in the map, plan and report mentioned herein.

2. That the proposed improvement consists of the construction of a conventional gravity sewer collection system with ultimate discharge to the Village of Malone collection and treatment system, and consisting of the installation of 6" PVC sewer laterals from each business connected to an 8" PVC sewer main placed within/or adjacent to the road right-of-way pursuant to the plans prepared by C2AE, Timothy Burley, P.E..

3. The maximum amount proposed to be expended for such improvement is \$357,000.00, and the maximum anticipated annual average cost per typical occupied property in the District for the aforesaid usage, commodity, operation and maintenance and debt service on capital improvements is the combined sum of \$1,280.00.

4. That the cost of the construction of the District improvement shall be charged on a benefit basis to those properties located within the service area to be benefited and served by the District improvement.

Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED:

a) That the Order Establishing Hearing on Sewer District Improvement was published and posted as required by Town Law, and is otherwise sufficient; and

b) That it is in the public interest to construct the proposed District improvement; and be it further **RESOLVED AND DETERMINED** that the proposed District improvement as set forth in the map, plan and report be approved; and that C2AE be directed to proceed with said improvement as agreed.

Bruce Burditt asked the amount of the increase. **Supervisor Maneely** said the hourly rate for litigation would increase from \$65.00 to \$150.00. **Arianna MacNeill** asked the reason for the increase. **Town Attorney Anderson-Duffy** replied that the request is still less than the usual rate for litigation services. She said she has been giving the Town a bargain for years, often not charging for litigation, and that most litigation for the Town is managed through insurance.

PRESENTATION TO THE BOARD:

2011 Audit Report – Nick Eells, of Dragon & Benware, presented the Audit findings for 2011, giving an "unqualified" opinion, meaning there are no significant concerns. He distributed a written report and reviewed highlights of it with the Board. There was some discussion about reserves and fund balances and he suggested that the Town consider a 5-year budget to plan for purchases and expenses. He said that post-retirement benefits are an expense that is difficult to predict and Towns are not allowed to create reserves for that purpose. He noted that Fixed Assets should be tracked and tagged and formal policies should be established. The Supervisor thanked Mr. Eells for his presentation.

Deputy Supervisor Walbridge said he would talk with highway union representative, Ricky Yelle and also with IBC, as a likely supplier of the boots.
